1317. Maria Anna,¹ Imperial Baroness² von Berchtold zu Sonnenburg, to Breitkopf & Härtel,³ Leipzig

Most nobly born!
Most highly estimable sir!

St. Gilgen, 29th *Oct.*, 1800.

Your valued communication of the 8th of this month reached me safely on the 25th, and I would have replied to you at once [5] if I had not wanted to wait until I could simultaneously inform you of the correct dispatch of the copied pieces of music, which I had already sent to the Mairische Buchhandlung⁴ on the 21st. But the information I got back from them was that they might not be able to send off this packet to you so soon because of a blocked post-route.⁵ I therefore wrote back to them [10] and asked them to send it to you via Linz or Prague.

Meanwhile I enclose for you the 2 accounts I have paid and after I have also paid the little expenses for the messengers, I shall draw up the final account. I hope you will be satisfied with the copying, yet at the same time I beg you most earnestly on no account to tell anyone [15] that these pieces were copied from the music at the Prince's court, 6 since my friend⁷ in Salzburg only made such efforts to obtain them out of friendship for me, and if it reached the Prince's ears, it could be unfortunate for him, and I myself would be placed in the greatest embarrassment. This friend also wrote to me asking whether I wanted to have the opera [20] la finta Semplice and the serenata il Sogno di Scipione the same way.⁸ But since I have already written to you on this matter, and have not yet received any answer, I did not know what I should tell him, since I was not so bold as to have these copied because the opera will amount to 220 sheets and the serenata will not be much less, [25] and each sheet is charged at 9 kreuzers, the money for copying would amount to quite a high sum; I am therefore waiting for your answer on this. I hope you will now surely have the score of the opera la finta giardiniera, which I had already sent off on the 1st of this month; I would wish to be informed of this. You are greatly mistaken in believing I had once written to you with something about the score of *Davide penitente*, [30] since I know neither the text nor the composition based on it. Moreover, I am not even sure that my brother wrote anything of the kind. With the opening themes which you sent me, I have now sent to Salzburg so as to have someone search out there the pieces you still lack. [35] Of these pieces, I know the quintet with the clavier, 10 which I have as in print, but only as a quartetto, for clavier, violin, viola et violoncello. I also enclose for you the opening themes of a sonata¹¹ with the accompagnement of a violin, which I also have in print, and of which the final Allegro is listed as a separate piece in your themes.
